Walking to the reception desk




I enter the Aquarium and I see the reception.

Getting my ticket




The Aquarium staff are friendly.

Before I start my visit



They might need to check my temperature and register my name.

This is done quickly.



The sounds at the Aquarium can be turned off during my visit.

I can ask a staff member to turn them off for me.

I can also ask for noise-cancelling headsets and fidgets if I want to.

Walking to the turnstiles



I go to the turnstiles and wait behind a line.



I present my ticket when it is my turn.

Before we enter the Aquarium, a staff member gives me instructions and helps me scan my ticket. I listen carefully.


Taking a photo before my visit




If I want to, a staff member will also take a photograph of us. I can say 'yes' or 'no'.

There are 6 zones that I can visit at the Aquarium.





At any moment If I need some time and space, I will tell one of the staff members that I want to use the Quiet Area.

They will take me to a lift which leads to the Quiet Area.

I go to the Quiet Area and can stay there for as long as I need to.





I enter the first zone of the Aquarium.

I see tanks with fish. I will not touch the water.

This is the Mediterranean Sea zone.

I see Maltese species and landscapes.

Accessing the Toilets



On this first zone I can also access the toilets. They are quiet, clean and spacious.



I go through the submarine.

It is a replica of a submarine used during World War II.





This is the Valletta Harbour zone.


Here I see a beautiful mural showing Malta's majestic harbour and some local fish too.

Here I see fish that live in lakes or rivers around the world.


Leaving the Aquarium
